




WSCC RECEIVES THE DAVID & MARTHA HESSLER ILLUMINATING HOPE AWARD

The Community West Foundation has been a long-running partner to the West Side Catholic Center. Originally known as the Fairview/Lutheran Foundation, Community West has been supporting many community non-profit agencies through grantmaking since 1997, with WSCC being the longest continuously fundednon-profitorganization by the foundation.

At the Community West Foundation's 25th Anniversary celebration in late July, WSCC



received the honor of being announced as the recipient of their annual David and Martha Hessler Illuminating Hope Award. The award, named after long-time Community West supporters and philanthropists David and Martha Hessler, was created to recognize a local non-profits with a deep history and commitment to our community that is truly "Illuminating Hope."

The award given to WSCC as the recipient is a replica of the "Homeless Jesus" statue by Canadian artist Timothy Schmalz, creator of the "Matthew 25 Collection" installed throughout Cleveland by the Community West Foundation. In addition to the award, WSCC was given a \$10,000 unrestricted grant. WSCC proudly displays this award on our reception desk today, and had it blessed by Fr. Tom Fanta at our 45th Anniversary Mass celebrated in August.
